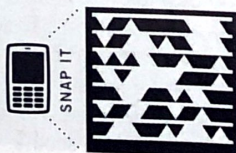
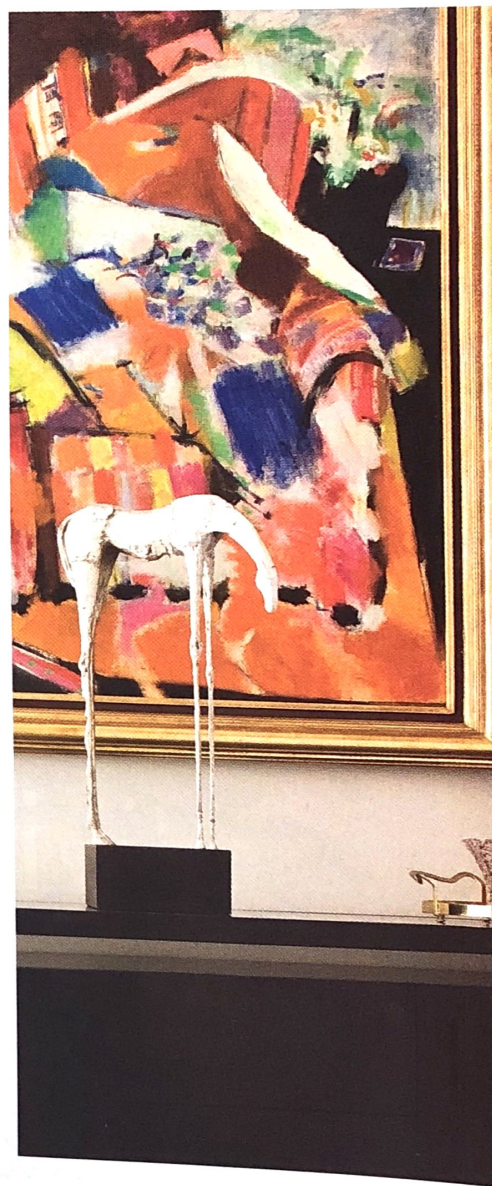
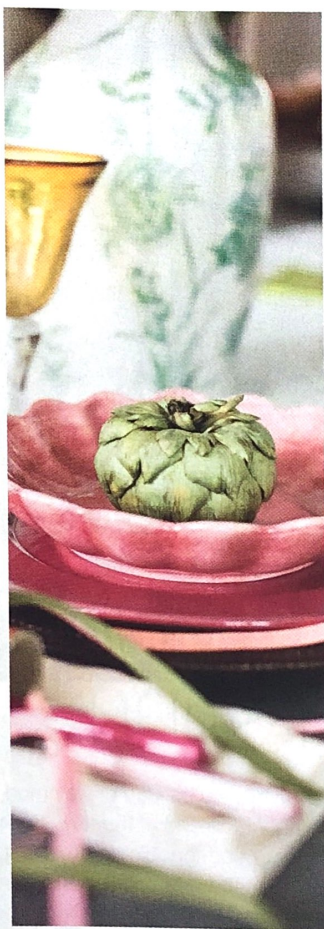
Showhouse showcase

With simplicity and elegance as trademarks, Brian Brady and Franco Biscardi wanted to "accentuate the master bathroom's grandeur and glamour, while keeping it warm and serene," says Brady. Always, the Brady Design team stresses what's apt for the location. Here, that meant a palette of blues and grays to evoke the sea. "The rich geometric blue-gray Holland & Sherry wallpaper and the opalescent antique Murano chandelier depict it perfectly." Glass tiles from Walker Zanger and Odegard tables in the shower enhance the lightness. A 1920 Swedish daybed stretches toward a BainUltra tub. The vanity sink is Kohler; plants/pots, Mecox Gardens. Greek-key embroidered linen shades are custom. ➤
